





A VIBRANT CITY OF INNOVATION



The city is home to self-driving cars and evolutionary electric buses, games development, international fashion exports, excellent research and classic innovators, music companies, and the creative industry. The companies are spread over a wide range of industries, some of them are small and independent, some of them are big global brands, but they are unified by their innovative thinking.

Gothenburg is an important hub for Swedish research and development. The city offers several science parks and the region's many testbeds provide great possibilities for testing products and services in virtual reality, in labs, in simulated environments and in real city environments. FOR YOUNGER KIDS the region offers an international school and a wide range of preschools, bilingual schools and private schools. The city is committed to giving kids of all ages a secure, stimulating and enjoyable start in life while offering parents the widest choice of education possible.

There are many well-equipped preschools and childcare centres (förskola) that are of a high standard and very affordable. In most cases both of the parents must work, study or be looking for a job in order for your child to get a place in a preschool. Your child must also be between 1 and 6 years old and have a Swedish personal identification number.

Fees are based on your household income and the number of children you have enrolled. The maximum monthly cost for one child is SEK 1 362 and for two children SEK 2 270.

Between the ages of 7 and 16, children are required to attend compulsory school (grundskola), free of charge, that is from grades 1-9. Your child always has the right to a place in school in the area where you live. You also have the right to choose another school.

Upper secondary school (gymnasium), or grades 10-12, is not compulsory but is attended by most young people in Sweden. It is also a prerequisite for tertiary studies. Your child can choose from a range of programmes, which will prepare them for working life or further studies.

In the region, there are a couple of world schools that offer the International Baccalaureate (IB) programme, which is taught in English. The IB diploma programme is an academically challenging and balanced international programme of education that prepares students, aged 16 to 19, for success at university and life beyond.
